This application meets all of the specifications listed in BVGCD Rule 7.1 (c) regarding production-based acreage. Below is the formula used to calculate and verify the applicant's compliance and was applied to each of the wells listed below:

Formula

acre feet/year x .62 = gpm on an average annual basis

Annual Average gpm x 1'/gpm for Simsboro wells = radius from the wellhead

radius x radius x 3.14 = square feet around the well

These are multi-use permits for Agricultural, Industrial, Commercial, Municipal, and Public Water Supply uses. Each well will be metered separately. The purpose of use from each well will be metered and reported separately.

The applicant is requesting increased production from each well as listed in the previous table. All hydrogeological evaluations of pumping effects on the Simsboro Aquifer, spacing of wells, and footprints drawn to determine contiguous acreage associated with each well were based on the amount listed in the amended Maximum Annual Production column. A posting error caused the permitted amounts to be proportionally lowered to match the cumulative amount listed on the Permit Hearing notice (16,421 ac-ft/yr). Total increase of permitted water production across all thirteen permits is 4,836 ac-ft/yr. Total maximum cumulative production will now be 21,257 ac-ft/yr.

The footprint of each of the wells lies entirely within the property controlled by the applicant.

This application is administratively complete.

It is the recommendation of the General Manager to approve the amendments to the thirteen (13) permits as presented and listed above.
