- Anderson Farm Well #2 (BVDO-0091) Located at: N 30.929765° W 96.725049°
 2.64 miles WSW of the intersection of FM 1644 and New Magnolia Church Road in Robertson County

Beneficial Use: Industrial Use

Aquifer of Origin: Simsboro (all three wells)

Well Column: 16" (all three wells)

Rate of Production: 2000 gpm (all three wells)

Max. Annual Production: BVDO-0055 (600 acre feet/year)

BVDO-0090 (600 acre feet/year)

BVDO-0091 (700 acre feet/year)
