

## Worksheet for an Operating Permit Amendment

### UW Brazos Valley Farm, LLC – BVOP-0136

UW Brazos Valley Farm, LLC seeks an amendment to the above listed Operating permit for the purpose of:

- Industrial Use – Water for oil & gas production

#### Approved Permit

Well #1C (**BVDO-0136**): Located at: N 30.88748416° W 96.65056522° 0.73 miles NNW of the intersection of John Reistino Road and FM 485 in Robertson County.

- Beneficial Use: Industrial – Water for oil & gas production

Aquifer of Origin: **Brazos River Alluvium**

Well Column: **16”**

Rate of Production: **750 gpm**

Max. Annual Production: **750 ac-ft/yr**

**The permit holder requests an amendment of the permit changing Industrial to Agricultural use. No additional water production is being requested.**

Application is administratively complete. It is the recommendation by the General Manager to approve the amendment to the listed permit as described above.

### Operating Permit Issued By Direction of the Board of Directors of the Brazos Valley Groundwater Conservation District

This **Operating Permit** is granted to **UW Brazos Valley Farm LLC** (Permittee) authorizing the Permittee to operate a water well, known as **Well #1C** ("Well"), at the location specified below within the Brazos Valley Groundwater Conservation District (District) for the beneficial purpose of producing water for **Agricultural** use. Permittee is authorized to operate the Well located at **N 30.88748416° and W 96.65056522°** to produce water from the **Brazos River Alluvium Aquifer** at an annual maximum capacity not to exceed **750 GPM** and a maximum annual production of **750 acre feet/year**.

#### Operating Permit Term:

- (a) An operating and drilling permit for a well or well site will automatically expire within three years from its issuance if the permitted well(s) has not been completed or is not significantly under development.
- (b) Unless specified otherwise by the Board or these Rules, operating permits are effective for five-year terms. At the end of each five-year term, the permit shall be renewed by the Board for an additional five-year term, upon submittal of a permit renewal application by the permit holder that provides adequate evidence of continued beneficial use for the permitted amount of water withdrawal. The District shall send notices to permit holders that contain the permit renewal applications, prior to permit expirations.
- (c) The District may amend or revoke an operating permit at any time if there is evidence of:
  - (1) the owner or operator of the well or well system has operated in violation of their permit, District Rules, or Chapter 36 of the Texas Water Code; or
  - (2) a change in the permit is required to prevent waste and achieve water conservation, minimize as far as practicable the drawdown of the water table or reduction of artesian pressure, lessen interference between wells, or control and prevent subsidence; or
  - (3) The permitted well(s) has not been completed, is not significantly under construction; or no significant progress is being made toward construction.

This permit is issued and effective as of February 14, 2013. This permit was reviewed and renewed on March 1, 2023. This permit was amended March 13, 2025 replacing Industrial use with Agricultural use.
