2. Discussion and possible action on the following **Drilling/Operating Permit Applications:**

Four (4) new wells for Hollybrook Plantation, LLC

Well #8 – **(BVDO-0310)** Located at: N 30.713505° W 96.586595° 1.98 miles WSW of the intersection of N. Astin Road and FM 50 in Robertson County. Total maximum annual production from the water well will be 34 ac-ft/yr at a maximum rate of 800 gpm for Agricultural use. Applicant requests the well be aggregated with BVOP-0247 & BVOP-0248 not to exceed 1250 ac-ft/yr of production from all wells. The well will produce from the Brazos River Alluvium Aquifer.

Well #9 – **(BVDO-0311)** Located at: N 30.721495° W 96.571600° 0.93 miles WSW of the intersection of N. Astin Road and FM 50 in Robertson County. Total maximum annual production from the water well will be 34 ac-ft/yr at a maximum rate of 800 gpm for Agricultural use. Applicant requests the well be aggregated with BVOP-0247 & BVOP-0248 not to exceed 1250 ac-ft/yr of production from all wells. The well will produce from the Brazos River Alluvium Aguifer.

Well #10 – **(BVDO-0312)** Located at: N 30.722277° W 96.570085° 0.77 miles WSW of the intersection of N. Astin Road and FM 50 in Robertson County. Total maximum annual production from the water well will be 34 ac-ft/yr at a maximum rate of 800 gpm for Agricultural use. Applicant requests the well be aggregated with BVOP-0247 & BVOP-0248 not to exceed 1250 ac-ft/yr of production from all wells. The well will produce from the Brazos River Alluvium Aquifer.

Well #11– (BVDO-0313) Located at: N 30.719705° W 96.564096° 0.69 miles SW of the intersection of N. Astin Road and FM 50 in Robertson County. Total maximum annual production from the water well will be 0 ac-ft/yr at a maximum rate of 800 gpm for Agricultural use. Applicant requests the well be aggregated with BVOP-0249 not to exceed 574 ac-ft/yr of production from both wells. The well will produce from the Brazos River Alluvium Aquifer. A motion was made by Jayson Barfknecht, second by Mark Carrabba to approve the Drilling/Operating permits for Hollybrook Plantation, LLC., for four (4) new wells that will produce from the Brazos River Alluvium Aquifer for agricultural use and aggregated with BVOP-0247, BVOP-0248 and BVOP-0249 as presented to the Board. The motion passed with Pete Brien abstaining.
