2. Pledge of Allegiance.

- 3. Discussion and possible action on the Minutes from the June 2010 Public Hearing and Regular Board Meeting. A motion was made by John Hicks, second by Wayne Wilson to accept the Minutes from the June 3, 2010 Board Meeting as presented. The motion carried unanimously.
- 4. Review and authorization of payments made for services rendered during the Month of June 2010. A motion was made by Wayne Wilson, second by Dan Kyle approve the expenses for the month of June 2010 as presented. The motion carried unanimously.
- 5. Discussion and possible action on approval of the proposed rule amendments to Rule 7.1 addressing maximum allowable production and permitting limits; Rule 8.3(h) addressing metering of wells and the secondary reuse of groundwater produced by Texas Railroad Commission permits; and the Fee Schedule, which includes the statutorily authorized export fee. A motion was made by John Hicks, second by Steve Beachy to table Item #5, (7.1), and return to the committee for further discussion. The motion carried unanimously. A motion by Tom McDonald, second by Dan Kyle to table item #5 8.3 (h), and return to the committee for further discussion. The motion carried unanimously. A motion by David Stratta, second by Steve Beachy, to

accept the fee schedule change as presented with the exception of all agricultural use being adjusted to 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents an acre foot for agricultural use. The motion carried unanimously.

- 6. Presentation by LBG-Guyton of information regarding Desired Future Conditions for the Yegua-Jackson and Brazos River Alluvium Aquifers. (Presentation attached)
- 7. Discussion and possible action on adopting DFC's, (Desired Future Conditions) for the Yegua, Jackson and Brazos River Alluvium Aquifers. A motion my John Hicks, second by Tom McDonald to adopt a DFC of 110 feet of drawdown in the Yegua Aquifer, and 70 feet of drawdown in the Jackson Aquifer. The motion carried unanimously. A motion by John Hicks, second by David Stratta to defer adopting a DFC for the Brazos River Alluvium Aquifer pending further discussion by the Management Plan Committee. The motion carried unanimously.
- 8&9. Discussion and possible action on the following Historic Use Permit Application:
 - A. Ten (10) existing wells for the Mears Farm, (Cliff Hoelscher owner). The wells are located on FSA, (Farm Service Agency) Farm #2650, which is situated on the Southwest corner, at the intersection of Hwy 485 and FM 1644, Hearne, TX for a total of 1,462 acre/feet per year for agricultural irrigation. The wells produce from the Brazos River Alluvium Aquifer. A motion by David Stratta, second by Tom McDonald to accept the application as presented for the Mears Farm for Historic Use. The motion carried unanimously.

At 3:35 Director, Wayne Wilson excused himself from the Board Meeting.

10. Update by the Management Plan Committee Chairman, and discussion by the Board, on topics discussed at the Management Plan Committee meeting held on June 17th.

John Hicks gave an update on having another committee meeting on July 22nd with Scott Swanson from Texas Commission Environmental Control (TCEQ) to help start writing the drought contingency plan.

11. Update by the Education Initiative Committee Chairman, and discussion by the Board on topics discussed at the Education Initiative Committee meeting held on June 17th.

Dan Kyle gave an update on Education Initiative Committee regarding the Commissioners Court having meetings in September and March. Providing the Commissioners Court with number of wells permitted, new wells that will be permitted, potential legislative action pending, a copy of the District's budget and education initiatives. Targeting fourth and fifth grade students and trying to work maybe with the Agriculture Extension office. Discuss any changes to the rules, status, the ability and the desired future conditions of the aquifers that the District oversees. The committee will meet again on July 22nd.

- 12. Discussion and possible action on approving a rebate to citizens within the District that purchase a rain water harvesting barrel. A motion by Steve Beachy, second by Dan Kyle to approve a \$25 dollar rebate per barrel, with a maximum of two barrels per household. \$2,500 was dedicated for this rebate program. The motion carried unanimously.
