- Discussion and possible action on the Minutes from the September 10, 2009 Public Hearing and Regular Board Meeting. A motion was made by Tom McDonald, second by Pete Brien to approve the Minutes from the September 10, 2009 Public Hearing and Regular Board Meeting as presented. The motion carried unanimously.
- 4. Review and Authorization of payments made for services rendered during the month of September 2009. A motion was made by Tom McDonald, second by John Hicks that expenses for the month of September 2009 be approved as presented. The motion carried unanimously.
- 5. Public Hearing for the purpose of taking public comment on the following

Historic Use Permit Application

A. Four (4) wells for Vence Corpora, (Hall Farm), designated as wells 1, 2, 3, and 4. The wells are located five miles south of Calvert on FM 1644, for a total of 580 acre/feet per year for irrigation. The wells are in the Brazos River Alluvium aquifer.

6. Discussion and possible action on the following

Historic Use Permit Application

- A. Four (4) wells for Vence Corpora, (Hall Farm), designated as wells 1, 2, 3, and 4. John Hicks, recommended that the job description should read that a background check would be made. The posting will be with the Texas Water Conservation Association, and Texas Rural Water Association.

A motion was made by Tom McDonald, second by Wayne Wilson to approve a contribution to the Robertson County Science Fair at the titanium level in the amount of \$3,000.00. The Board asks that Water Conservation be considered in the instruction of the science fair. The motion carried unanimously.
