The wells will produce in aggregate from the Brazos River Alluvium Aquifer. A motion was made by David Stratta, second by Tom McDonald to approve with Historical use the twenty (20) existing wells for M&M Farms located below Brazos County for 2,400 acre-feet per year, and the wells will be aggregated.   - One (1) existing well for Steele Brook Mineral & Royalty, Ltd. Well #7 is located at N 30.651135° W 96.539122° 0.29 miles NE of the intersection of FM 50 and Steele Store Road in Brazos County for a total of 80 acre feet per year for agricultural irrigation use. The well will produce from the Brazos River Alluvium Aquifer. A motion was made by David Stratta, second by Mark Carrabba to approve the existing operating permit for Steele Brook Mineral & Royalty, Ltd., as presented. The motion passed unanimously.
  - One (1) existing well for Dorothy Borski. Well #1 is located at N 30.653127°
     W 96.199092° 2.64 miles SSE of the intersection of Hardy Weedon Road and Weedon Loop in Brazos County for a total of 56 acre feet per year for industrial use. The well will produce from the Yegua-Jackson Aquifer. A motion by David Stratta, second by Tom McDonald to approve the existing operating permit for Dorothy Borski as presented. The motion passed with six (6) directors and one (1) President, Bryan Russ, Jr., opposed.
  - One (1) existing well for David Price. Well #1 is located at N 30.649240° W 96.208763° 2.28 miles SE of the intersection of Hardy Weedon Road and Weedon Loop in Brazos County for a total of 19.36 acre feet per year for industrial use. The well will produce from the Yegua-Jackson Aquifer. A motion was made by Bill L. Harris, second by Kent Watson to approve the existing operating permit for David Price as presented. The motion passed with six (6) directors and one (1) President, Bryan F. Russ, Jr., opposed.
- 6. Discussion and possible action on the following Drilling/Operating Permit Application:
  - One (1) new well for Steele Brook Mineral & Royalty, Ltd. Well #8 will be located at N 30.655394° W 96.534302° 0.69 miles NE of the intersection of FM 50 and Steele Store Road in Brazos County for a total of 180 acre feet per year for agricultural irrigation use. The well will produce from the Brazos River Alluvium Aquifer. A motion was made by Stephen A. Boykin, second by Mark Carrabba to approve the new Drilling/Operating permit well #8 for Steele Brook Mineral & Royalty, Ltd., as presented. The motion passed unanimously.
