LEGAL NOTICE

The **Brazos Valley Groundwater Conservation District (District)**, in compliance with Chapter 36 of the Texas Water Code and its Rules, will receive public comment on proposed amendments to the Rules of the District at a public hearing to be held at the Carter's Creek Wastewater Training Facility, 2200 North Forest Parkway, College Station, Texas 77845 at 2:00 p.m. on Thursday, August 10, 2017. The proposed District Rule amendments relate to: deadlines pertaining to desired future conditions, the production based acreage rule and related definitions, the applicability of spacing requirements, and permit application requirements.

The District Board, at the conclusion of the public hearing, will discuss comments received and consider possible adoption of the proposed rule. Written and oral public comments on the proposed rule must be submitted to the District on or prior to the hearing date. The Board of Directors may meet in closed session, pursuant to the Texas Open Meetings Act, Texas Government Code §§ 551.071-551.076, to:

- (1) consult with attorney ;
- (2) deliberate regarding the purchase, exchange, lease, or value of real property if deliberation in an open meeting would have a detrimental effect on the position of the District in negotiations with a third person;
- (3) deliberate a negotiated contract for a prospective gift or donation to the District if deliberation in an open meeting would have a detrimental effect on the position of the District in negotiations with a third person;
- (4) to deliberate the appointment, employment, evaluation, reassignment, duties, discipline or dismissal of a Board member or District employee;
- (5) to receive information from employees or question employees, but not deliberate public business or agency policy that affects public business; and
- (6) to deliberate the deployment or specific occasions for implementation of security personnel or devices.

The Board may also meet in open session on these matters as required by the Texas Open Meetings Act, Texas Government Code § 551.102.
